About the Bulletin Cover The illustration on the front of the bulletin is a sixth century A.D. painting depicting the coming of the wise men to honor the newborn king. The larger church tradition points to this episode from Matthew 2 as the culmination of the Season of Christmas; it is referred to as the Epiphany of the Lord on the church's calendar and occupies the date of January 6. "Epiphany" means "manifestation" and has to do with the recognition of the wise men concerning Christ's divine kingship. It proclaims the message that Christ has come in order that all may be saved, and not just the children of Israel. The Sundays after Epiphany, though not governed explicitly by this theme, do have to do with the way in which Christ's divine nature was manifest to the world through various of his words and deeds. During these days, we will recall the acts of the magi in honoring Christ as we come to bring our tithes and offerings to the Lord in worship.
